

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK ...

We are back in Ordinary Time entering the Second Week of Ordinary Time. Normally the First Week begins with the Baptism of Our Lord, but this year it technically began with the Epiphany. This is due to the way Christmas fell, and how the Church places her feasts and the importance of them. This year instead of celebrating the Baptism of the Lord on a Sunday, it was celebrated on the Monday following the Epiphany.

This Sunday we pick up the Gospel reading of what happens after the Baptism of our Lord. We hear John the Baptist say "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." These very words are announced before we our Lord in the Eucharist. This shows the unique importance and the tie between these two sacraments.

Baptism and Holy Communion are two of three of the Sacraments of initiation along with the Sacrament of Confirmation. Baptism remits all sin, both original and actual sins committed before baptism. It also remits all punishment due to sin whether temporal or eternal. Finally, Baptism leaves an indelible mark that shows that we belong to Christ and his Church. Those who have received baptism, once they reach the age of reason, are allowed to receive the Eucharist. In receiving the Eucharist, we receive the Lord truly present in the bread and wine sacrificed at the mass. To profit from reception of the Eucharist, we must be free from mortal sin. However, frequent reception of the Eucharist remits venial sins, and the graces received help unite us more closely to the heart of Christ.

After these Advent and Christmas seasons let us take more seriously our need to grow in knowledge and understanding of these two sacraments, and the importance of the other five sacraments as well. God desires us to be a grace filled people and to do this we must be frequent participants of the Sacraments, so that we can receive that grace. Let us take more seriously our need to be worthy recipients of Christ in the Eucharist.
