FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK...

Third Sunday of Lent

When I was a Theology teacher at the high school level, I always made sure that my students knew the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. In fact, this was part of passing their religion classes. These works of mercy are ways that we can take care of the bodily and spiritual needs of our brothers and sisters. They can also be starting points to making Lent more productive in helping us follow the will of God.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, give alms to the poor, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. Not only are these ways to use Lent to grow closer to the Lord, they are very much part of living the stewardship way of life.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are: instruct the ignorant, counsel the doubtful, admonish the sinner, forgive injuries, comfort the sorrowful, bear wrong patiently, and pray for the living and the dead. These are very much ways that we can evangelize by living a proper example to others.

This week’s Gospel is the woman at the well. Jesus admonishes her for having had five husbands and living with a sixth. While it may seem difficult to admonish the sinner the Lord gives us an excellent example, as this woman ends up desiring to have her thirst quenched by the living water that is the Lord.

May we be more aware of the works of mercy, and strive to live them out in a deeper and richer way. For example we can pray for the living especially those who are different than us on a daily basis, turning our negativity into a positive. We can pray for the dead by having masses offered for the dead, which is the most fruitful prayer we can offer for the dead. Let us work more diligently on fulfilling the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, it will benefit us all.

For those who wish to celebrate St. Patrick's Day, Bishop W. Shawn McKnight has approved a dispensation permitting Catholics in our diocese to consume meat on March 17. Bishop McKnight encourages those who do so to observe one of three alternative penances: participate at Mass, participate in the Stations of the Cross or pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary.
