FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK...

Second Sunday of Lent

Lent is a time of metanoia, change. Change can be hard. It’s not that we all don’t want to become a better person, but we become comfortable where we are at or who we are currently. Metanoia is a Greek term used predominantly in the Gospels with the teaching of the Apostles. Metanoia is literally repentance or penance. Repentance is shown by faith, baptism, confession of sins, and producing fruits worthy of penance. It means a change of heart from sin to the practice of virtue. As conversion, it is fundamental to the teaching of Christ, and was the first thing demanded by Peter on Pentecost, and is considered essential to the pursuit of Christian perfection.

Metanoia is to truly become a new creation in Christ. Our Lenten observances of fasting, almsgiving and penance allow us to step outside ourselves and view the world and its people with the eyes of Christ. It is a time to renew our commitment to Christ and the work of the Kingdom. It is a time to allow the Gospel message of salvation to transform us, to Transfigure us into true disciples.

This might be hard. We might make a few steps of progress, just to find ourselves stumbling backwards into our old habits. Don’t give up! You can do it! Christ took 12 “normal” guys and transformed the world. You only have to change one person, yourself. By growing in virtues and thus holiness you, yourself, will change the world. Have a great Lent.

For those who wish to celebrate St. Patrick’s Day, Bishop W. Shawn McKnight has approved a dispensation permitting Catholics in our diocese to consume meat on March 17. Bishop McKnight encourages those who do so to observe one of three alternative penances: participate at Mass, participate in the Stations of the Cross or pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary.

STEWARDSHIP Q & A

Q: In the stewardship way of life model, are Rice Bowls still allowed?

A: Parishes can continue to do rice bowls in the stewardship model. This would be part of an individual’s “2%” contribution (that part of what you are not already tithing to the parish). Money can be contributed directly to the Catholic Relief Services or given to the parish to “pass along” to Catholic Relief Services. Any monies collected at the parish level for the rice bowl is not counted in the parish’s tithe to the Diocese.
